
Farrel adjourned this meeting at 8:30 PM.

There were 57 participants in the Zoom meeting. There were 46 voting members in attendance. Chad Christensen was represented by proxy.








Opening Slide. This slide was shared at the opening of the General meeting as landowners were admitted to the meeting. A test meeting was scheduled the evening before the General Meeting to allow landowners not familiar with Zoom to test their ability to connect. 7 members tested Zoom the night before. They all joined the meeting with ease.

A brief tutorial of the screen was shared with those who had connected, explaining how to mute, share, chat, view the meeting.

Farrel Lewis called the meeting to order stating that a quorum was present. He then welcomed new landowners to the Association.








Nate Ariatti introduced Jake Forsgren of the Cache County Weed Department to the group. Jake gave a presentation to the Association on what the County is doing to help control noxious weeds in the County and in particular at the Association. Those landowners may contact Jake if they would like their properties sprayed by his department. [See Nate for that contact information.]

Nate next discussed mosquito abatement. Blaine Jorgensen [abatement officer] had trouble connecting to the Zoom meeting. Nate shared with the group that Blaine has retired and will no longer have access to abatement materials. They will now be included in the budget. Blaine has those materials to provided the Association at no cost in the past. Nate indicated that landowners could contact either Blaine or himself if they had special abatement issues on their properties.

Nate next shared with the group water flow charts for all four springs owned by the Association.



Nate the showed pictures of the repair of the East Spring completed in August of 2020.

Farrel asked Mike Gailey to report on the action of the Communication's Committee. Mike reported that he'd sent out a survey of the members to see what kind of damage had been caused during the Fall windstorm. Mike reported that he'd received 14 responses. Structural damaged was Easment clearing was well minimal. supported. Harvesting down fall on another property was not favored.

Mike also reported on the petition generated by HPME to encourage Cache County to give greater attention to the Ant Flat Road. As of the general meeting the Association had 13 signers. Members were encouraged to sign the petition and forward it back to Mike Gailey.


A post on the HPME Facebook page was concerned about Weber County closing the Ant Flat Road seasonally form November 15 – March 15 to vehicular traffic. This would not affect snowmobilers. There was not much discussion of this item since only snow machines traverse the road during that proposed seasonal closure.



Mike Gailey asked for motions from the floor nominating members to serve on the HPME Board. After considerable time, Mike asked that the existing Board members up for election be retained by acclamation and approved by voice vote. A voice vote was taken and appeared to be unanimous. Rick, Russ, Mike and Dennis will be retained for another two-year term.



Farrel asked Bruce Petersen to report on that Activities Committee. Bruce reported that the Annual Picnic is scheduled for August 7, 2021 at the Lockhart's property. We will meet a 1:00 PM. Bring a potluck to share. The Association will furnish drinks, meat and paper goods. Bruce then brought back the Association General Meeting raffle and gave instructions on how to claim your winnings. This was the first of three raffle segments.



Farrel asked Gary Nuffer to give a financial report. After addressing the membership Gary asked for a motion to approve the financial statements. Paul Burbank made a motion to approve. Jim Reams provided a second. A voice vote was called. It appeared to by unanimous.



Farrel asked Dennis Kendrick to report on keys and security. Dennis reported that a new cut will be made on one set of the Association keys and reissued next March. There will be no key exchange again this year. The next key exchange will be in March 2022.

Farrel asked Mike Schmidt to review the actions of the Emergency Preparedness and Fire Committee. Mike informed the membership that just as soon as we can meet together again, this committee will be reorganizing a calling tree to keep members aware of emergency situations at the property. This function has I the past fallen on the Communications Committee. The Board feels this is a better fit.

Mike then reviewed with the membership proper bear etiquette.

In light of the recent windstorm, Mike reviewed the need to clearing deadfall and other fuels meditation protocols to prevent lose of life and property at the Association.

Mike reviewed that the governing documents place a 15-mph speed limit on all vehicular traffic at HPME. Speeding is an accident waiting to happen.

Mike reviewed the current landing sites established by HPME and updated annually by this Committee for emergency helicopter evacuation. A card was mailed to each landowner reminding each of these landing sites with the current fee billing mailed by Gary Nuffer. Finally a proposed addition to the Bylaws was read establishing a severe penalty for anyone proven guilty of theft of damage to any Association sign.

The proposed question was placed on a vitual ballot. The vote was 42-2 in favor of adding these lines to the governing documents.

### Bylaw Overview, Continued

- Sewage and Drainage- No septic system installation without County permit
- Temporary housing (trailers) shall be removed from association between December and April
- Outdoor Firepits- outdoor burning is prohibited except in pits constructed according to US Forest Service regulations



Farrel asked Russ Ridges to report on the actions of the Development Committee.

Russ shared with the group the contact information for the members of this committee.

He then reviewed the purpose of the committee.

He reminded the landowners that there a Bylaw and CCR rules that govern development within the Association; that along with a County permit, and development has to meet with the development committee.


\* Third Lottery Give Away
